Rebuilding the Bridge in MacDougall Park by Lindley McPhail

This is it!! This is finally the year that there will be a footbridge put back in MacDougall Park! We are very excited about this important milestone in the rejuvenation of Russell's first public park.

The original footbridge was built around 1940 and did not survive the test of time. Learning from the past, we are now in the final planning stages for a new bridge built using a dry stone arch technique with iron railings. Dry stone bridges have stood for hundreds of years in Europe but to our knowledge it will be the first in a Canadian park.

Designed by Cindy Cluett of <u>Beyond the House</u>, and John Shaw-Rimmington of the Dry Stone Wall Association of Canada (<u>www.dswac.ca</u>), this bridge will be built using primarily local materials and contractors. A stately structure in harmony with its natural environments, Russell's bridge is sure to be a frequently visited and photographed landmark. But it won't happen without your help.

There are several ways you can be involved in this historic build creating a landmark in the heart of our community. Donors will be included in a book to be published about MacDougall Park Bridge. It will include stories and pictures of the original bridge, we will follow the looks and use of the park up to and including this rebuild. This book will be place in both the library and in the Keith Boyd Museum. There will also be a commemorative plaque placed near the bridge.

You can become involved with this project in one (or more) of the following ways:
